called Noteworthy Maps by the Library of Congress. The map listed which is of most interest to students of history in the State of Washington is that of the Pacific Ocean, page 26. "This black and white map contains a descriptive note, indicating that the map was made after the second voyage of the *Hercules* in the year 1784."
