

sixteen prominent American educators including Jesse F. Steiner, Professor of Sociology, University of Washington.

The book is the "outcome of a very large number of special studies and researches and of a vast deal of deliberation and reflection during the past five years."

These conclusions may be taken as a summary, or result, of the fourteen major and several supplementary published volumes of the Commission's Final Report. It will undoubtedly be accepted as a sort of hand-book of the larger series.
