The 2nd INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE PALAEOENVIRONMENT OF EAST ASIA will be held at the Centre of Asian Studies, University of Hong Kong, January 9-14, 1987. Further details are available from the Centre of Asian Studies, Pokfulam Road, Hong Kong (convenors E.K.Y. Chen and R.O. Whyte).

This Bulletin also carries an obituary on Bob Fox, a recently-elected Honorary Member of our asociation. Bob was not able to attend the Penablanca congress, and I think that one small tribute which IPPA can offer is to dedicate this issue of the Bulletin to his memory.
