

Announcement

¶ The Journal of Occurrences at Nisqually House, begun in this Quarterly, issue of July, 1915, will end in the present issue. It has required a full year to reproduce the first volume of the fifteen or more volumes known to be in existence. Those extensive manuscripts are of prime importance as sources of Northwest history. The relatively small portion published gives the foundation and first two years' record of the famous Hudson's Bay Company's fort on Puget Sound.

¶ A number of pioneers have responded to the editorial appeal of the Seattle Post-Intelligencer of December 25, 1915, by sending manuscript records and old account books for permanent preservation in the fire-proof section of the University of Washington Library.

¶ The Division of Northwest Research, Department of History, University of Washington, has accumulated more than ten thousand reference cards on the origin and meaning of place names in the State of Washington. The mass of information will be compiled into a volume for geographical and historical reference. The book will probably be ready for publication within the next year.
