- ¶ In response to requests for information about Grand Coulee, Dean Henry Landes, well known authority on the geology of the Pacific Northwest, has prepared an article for this issue in which he assembles the results of the latest studies of that remarkable geographic feature of Washington.
- ¶ From a similar spirit of service a brief article is published on the source of the name of Mount Saint Helens on request of those who are building the new city of Longview at the mouth of Cowlitz River.
- ¶ The pioneer, Albert J. Thompson, received so many compliments for his article on the history of White Salmon that he was encouraged to write his memories of the Atanum Valley, in the Yakima Country of the early days.
- ¶ Notwithstanding the loss of records by fire, Mr. Oliphant has succeeded, after extensive research, in assembling a satisfactory history of the Benjamin P. Cheney Academy, on whose foundations was built the Washington State Normal School at Cheney.
