Louisiana Place-Names of Indian Origin. By WILLIAM A. READ, Ph.D. (Baton Rouge: Louisiana State University, 1927. Pp. 72.)

The author is Professor of English Language and Literature in the Louisiana State University. His work, excellently done, shows an unusual wealth of place-names derived directly or indirectly from the Indian languages. Any reader can detect the vast amount of patient work involved in a compilation of this nature.
