- ¶ Although he is now located in Bucknell University, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, Professor J. Orin Oliphant is still interested in the history of the Pacific Northwest, as shown by his article on the "Pioneer Baptist Missionaries in Oregon."
- ¶ J. Neilson Barry, of Portland, Oregon, continues his active researches in Indian and pioneer history.
- ¶ The author of the article, "Mormon Colonization Scheme for Vancouver Island," J. B. Munro, is Deputy Minister of Agriculture at Victoria, British Columbia. The Oregon Country was involved in that scheme of colonization.
